RSV Vaccination

From September we will be holding clinics for the new RSV vaccine.

What is RSV?

RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) is an infectious disease of the airways and lungs. It can make you become wheezy or short of breath and lead to pneumonia and other life threatening conditions.

If you are aged 75-79 you will receive a booking link or text or will be contacted by one of our team to book into one of our September clinics.

Hospital Appointments

You can now review your Hospital appointments and referrals via the NHS APP. You can view waiting times, book/change and cancel appointments

and view notifications all on the APP.

If a patient is aged 16-17, they may not be able to view or manage some of their hospital appointments. This is because some NHS trusts require patients to be aged 18 or over to access these appointments.

Access your appointments in the NHS APP by clicking on the "appointments" icon at the bottom of the first screen then clicking on "Referrals, hospital and other appointments". You will be able to see if any referrals need actioning/booking and your booked appointments.
